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MAYORS ANNUAL REPORT

TOWN CLERKS ANNUAL REPORT

Last year was the first full year of responsibility for the public toilets in the town. It is surprising how much work is involved in the management of this vital facility, which includes two toilets in the town and two that are located in the parks. The toilets in the parks are open during British Sumer Time. Sadly our toilets are not always respected by a small number of people who seem to want to either try or burn them down of vandalise them. We also have a drug user problem in the town toilets which is most unpleasant to our toilet attendants.

Part of my role involves keeping up with changes in Government legislation to ensure that the Council operates in a lawful manner. Both of my administration team are working towards gaining their qualifications in Council administration. I was part of the team that looked at the change from an examination style pass to the more flexible National Vocational Qualification, and this is proving to be far more relevant to staff undertaking this qualification because it requires them to undertake a number of case studies and provide examples of good practice.

Whilst the pressure is on to take over more responsibilities from the principle councils we have been able to, with the aid of good housekeeping, to keep the general expenditure down; and therefore the general tax demand lower. The Government grant however provided in conjunction with changes to benefits is being cut each year and does not help the cause, but there is little that we can do about it.

One thing that is annoying is the fact that we are required to pay business rates on the two public toilets in the town. The National Association of Local Councils has campaigned to Government Ministers to either reduce or cut out this rather stupid requirement. It is interesting, but slightly illogical to note that Business Rates are not required on the two toilets in the parks.

We have a full complement of councillors at present and provided training to them last year after the election. We have agreed to provide further training opportunities for the elected members after the May meeting.

CIVIC COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT

There have been five meetings of the Civic and Ceremonial committee this year which has helped Tiverton maintain its civic traditions.

During the year, one mace has been repaired and the other has had a temporary repair. The casket is also in the process of being mended.

It was agreed that the Town Crier competition had been a very enjoyable event which had seen a record of 13 town criers taking part.

A perambulation subcommittee was formed from the members of the City and Ceremonial

committee. The team is now actively engaged in organising the event for 9 September 2017. They have started liaising with the relevant landowners and other interested parties. They will also organise refreshments, musical entertainment and marquee hire together with the necessary return transport.

After the mayor's choosing on 9th May the mayor's church service will be on 15th May. The Mayor's Banquet is set for the 9th of July at the Tiverton Hotel. Similar to last year, tickets for this event will be purchased. Lastly, the proclamation of the fair will be held on 16 June.

FINANCE AND GENERAL PURPOSES COMMITTEE ANNUAL REPORT

The committee meets on the second Monday in the month and examines all income and expenditure for the previous month. The committee has also had to look at the task of taking on additional responsibilities from the district council following their reduction in grant from Central Government. This has included, for the new financial year commencing the 1st April 2016, contributions towards grass cutting and the upkeep of playing fields.

At the last meeting of the Finance Committee we received a detailed report from the town clerk regarding the possible change of ownership of this Town Hall from Mid Devon District Council to the Town Council. The committee endorsed the recommendation from the town clerk that this council would proceed with negotiation with MDDC with a view of the change of ownership being the 1st April 2017. This recommendation will now go before the full council in May.

Part of the remit of this committee is to prepare, in association with the Responsible Financial Officer, the budget. Despite the increasing pressures being placed on the council we were able to maintain a reasonable D rate contribution, with a small increase to you of only £3.49 a year. The D rate for 2016/17 is £40.29; which is about half of the rate set by Cullompton Town Council.

The committee also makes recommendations of the Town & Parishes Together Fund, which is a fund set up by Devon County Council in which the County pays £1, and the district pays 10p per elector into a fund that provides small grants to local schemes to improve life in Tiverton and the surrounding area. We have also maintained our general grant scheme to local organisations, although we have reduced the total amount of funding available.

I would like to thank the town clerk and his staff for maintaining the accounts and to my fellow councillors for their support.
