Also reminded to catch coughs and sneezes in tissues – Follow Catch it, Bin it, Kill it and to avoid touching face, eyes, nose or mouth with unclean hands. Tissues will be made available throughout the workplace. Cleaning

Frequently cleaning and disinfecting objects and surfaces that are touched regularly particularly in areas of high use such as door handles, light switches, reception area using appropriate cleaning products and methods.

Social Distancing

Social Distancing -Reducing the number of persons in any work area to comply with the 2-metre (6.5 foot) gap

Checks will be carried out by Town Clerk to ensure that the necessary procedures are being followed.

Staff to be reminded on a daily basis of the importance of social distancing both in the workplace and outside of it.

Checks to ensure this is adhered to.

Internal communication channels and cascading of messages through Town Hall Staff and Members will be carried out regularly to reassure and support employees in a fast changing situation.

Town Clerk will offer support to staff who are affected by Coronavirus or has a family member affected.

Also relocating workers to other tasks. Redesigning processes to ensure social distancing in place. Conference calls to be used instead of face to face meetings. Ensuring sufficient rest breaks for staff. **Wearing of Gloves** Where Risk Assessment identifies wearing of gloves as a requirement of the job, an adequate supply of these will be provided. Staff will be instructed on how to remove gloves carefully to reduce contamination and how to dispose of them safely. Masks will also be provided for use when addressing members of the public in the foyer.



PPE Public Health guidance on the use of PPE (personal protective equipment) to protect against COVID-19 relates to health care settings. In all other settings individuals are asked to observe social distancing measures and practice good hand hygiene behaviours **Symptoms of Covid-19** If anyone becomes unwell with a new continuous cough or a high temperature they will be sent home and advised to follow the stay at home guidance. Town Clerk will maintain regular contact with staff members during this time. If advised that a member of staff or public has developed Covid-19 and were recently in the Town Hall, the Town Clerk will contact the Public Health Authority to discuss the case, identify people who have been in contact with them and will take advice on any actions or precautions that should be taken. https://www.publichealth.hscni.net/
